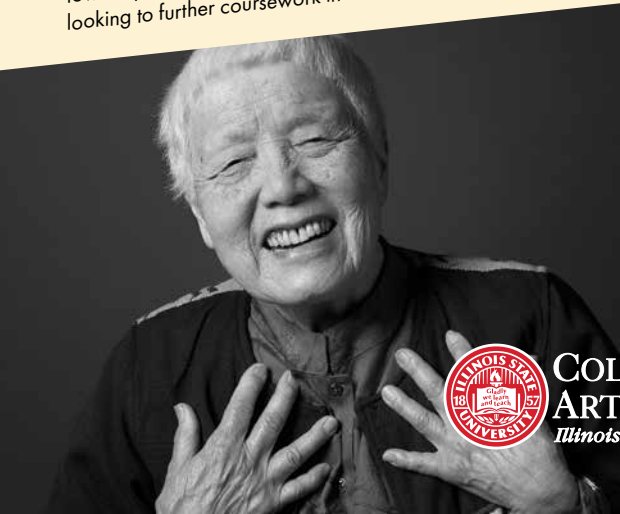




WOMEN'S, GENDER, AND SEXUALITY STUDIES PROGRAM GRADUATE CERTIFICATE

The graduate certificate in Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (WGSS) offers graduate students the opportunity to study gender and its intersections with race, ethnicity, sexuality, class/caste, ability, nationality, and other aspects of identity—within the student's chosen fields of interest. It's an option for students whose interests in sex, gender, and sexuality leads them toward particular courses and thesis topics in their home department/school, or those who are looking to further coursework in interdisciplinary methods and feminist theories.

Why get a graduate certificate in WGSS?

The WGSS graduate certificate is open to all students whose professional goals would be enriched integrating a working knowledge of gender issues with their graduate curriculum. Students who complete the four-course sequence (12 hours) can apply what they've learned to positions in education, government, nonprofit organizations, activism, journalism, law, public policy, healthcare, social services, and careers in the humanities and fine arts.

One required core class:

Either WGS 490: Feminist Theories and Methodologies, or ENG 460: Feminist Literary Theories.

Three electives:
