Manne regularly writes opinion pieces, essays, and reviews on moral and political topics—in venues including *The New York Times, The Boston Review*, the *Huffington Post, The Chronicle of Higher Education*, and the *Times Literary Supplement*. Manne's address begins with the question:

WHAT ARE THE UNDERLYING CAUSES OF MISOGYNY?

In many cases, she argues, it stems from a wrongheaded sense of moral entitlement to a woman's sexual, emotional, reproductive, and material labor.


